## HOATH PARISH COUNCIL Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on 15<sup>th</sup> May 2023

The Meeting was held in Hoath Village Hall for the transaction of the following business:

1. Welcome introduction:

Residents were welcomed to the Annual Parish meeting.

- 2. Acknowledgement of local activities and achievements by the residents in the Parish of Hoath in the last 12 months:
  - Hoath parish council has taken ownership of the New Village Green and Carpark currently take shape with the planting of new saplings (the shade of which the next generation will sit in).
  - There was the launch of a free 'Hoath Newsletter' for every home in the Parish, edited by a local resident.
  - The Jubilee Event was attended by virtually the entire village, celebrating the reign of our late Queen. The weekend included activities on the Green, a separate lunch in the Village Hall and wonderful floral display in Holy Cross church. All were extremely well attended.
  - A Christmas Event was held in the Village Hall, with singing and dancing. With a lit and decorated tree on the green.
  - Also, at Xmas the parish was able to donate hampers and vouchers to residents who were less fortunate than others.
  - KCC Cllr Alan Marsh provided funding for over 20 residents to see the Panto at Broadstairs, including free return transport.
  - HPC launched the start of the Neighbourhood plan, this is empowering the Hoath community to develop a shared vision for its neighbourhood and shape the development and growth of the local area.
  - Our first No Mow May, with a view to making the current un-mowed section a wild flower area next year.
  - The defibrillator at the Village Hall is back and serviceable, and a second is to be purchased (to be installed on an external wall at The Prince of Wales public house.
  - Coffee Mornings: The Church holds monthly coffee mornings with its bring and buy, the village had its first post-covid weekday coffee mornings which were initiated by Rural Kent and held on the village green. These have since moved to the Village Hall monthly, on a Saturday. The Prince of Wales public house also holds coffee mornings for the community; all of these are free initiatives and are run on a voluntary basis (donations are always welcome).
  - There have been new residents to welcome, not only the Marley Fields development who have all moved in, but also new Landlords at both the Prince of Wales and the Gales at the Gate.
  - We have a new Councillor: Karen Johncock who is already active in the community and her family contribute significantly to village life.
  - The Hoath Parish Facebook page has been refreshed and grown significantly in 6 months, to over 300 followers, with one post reaching over 9000 members. The Website continues to grow, but it can only be as good as the information provided to the council.
  - We have had some success with KCC Highways, new yellow lines at the school, Hoath gates and other signage now visible and potholes are being attended to when reported.

- The community managed to get the Planning Committee from CCC to visit the digestate eco bag location.
- There are some 'Secret Gardeners' out and about in Hoath, currently attending to the traffic triangle at Marley Lane and Church Road.
- A Coronation Big Lunch Event was held and it was wonderful to see the community enjoying the sunshine and music, did you get to sample the free cheese? Great spirit was shown from the residents. A great raffle and a guess the balloons competition. All prizes were kindly donated by local businesses with £354 raised.
- There was a Rogation Walk with beating of the bounds, attended by many, followed by a delicious lunch in the village hall.
- And we must congratulate the WI at Hoath for their wonderful Post box toppers, they are simply joyful to see.
- A great year in the Parish to celebrate and another first for Hoath with a guest speaker at its Annual Parish Meeting
